A Message from Father Aaron

"Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."

Our Catholic Church and her people are experiencing unprecedented persecution in various forms today. The Church is the most persecuted Church because it is the Church Christ established and he was greatly persecuted. Venerable Fulton Sheen once said, "Wherever you find the persecuted Church you find the true Church." So, in sense it comes along with being Catholic. However, we must remember that after the cross comes the glory of resurrection.

Our day's persecution is not so much a physical one but a silent one. This persecution holds bound those who want to speak and live out their beliefs with a claim of discrimination against anyone who chooses to not support a lifestyle that is against the moral teachings of the Church. For instance, on unborn life, same-sex attraction, gender dysphoria or contraception. Of course we are always called to respect, love and be patient with those who may struggle to accept God's truth, knowing that all people are welcome to Christ's merciful redemption.

In 2014 an executive order from the President, barring federal contractors from engaging in practices deemed to be discriminatory against LGBT employees, with no religious exemptions attached for organizations that have religious objections to gay marriage or adoption.

Now, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops are trying to gather signatures asking the President to sign a religious freedom executive order as they site "unprecedented" threats to religious freedom. "Religious freedom in America has suffered years of unprecedented erosion. Our President can correct some of this within the executive branch," a USCCB action alert stated.

Along with a religious exemption to the LGBT executive order for federal contractors, the petition asks for "relief" from the HHS contraception mandate for the Little Sisters of the Poor, protections for religious schools to publicly affirm their beliefs on marriage, the continuance of the tax-exempt status for religious organizations that support traditional marriage, and conscience protections for doctors and hospitals refusing to perform abortions.

The challenges before us now are not greater than the grace God is willing to give those who stand firm in the truth of Jesus Christ. "Where sin abounds grace abound all the more." May we continue to pray for precious religious freedom and also pray for the freedom gained by forgiving. God bless you,
