A Catechetical Moment: Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is one of the most unique and beautiful aspects of our Catholic faith. Jesus Christ, in His abundant love and mercy, established the Sacrament of Confession, so that we, as sinners, can obtain forgiveness for our sins and reconcile ourselves with God and the Church. The sacrament "washes us clean." and renews us in Christ.

How do you make a good confession? The most important things about making a good confession is truly being sorry for the sins you commit, having the intention of returning to God with your whole heart and to do this before a priest. Why in front of a priest? Because that's the way God intended it to be. After Jesus' death and resurrection he appeared to the disciples and said, "Receive the holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

(John 20:22-23) Jesus sends out His disciples with the authority on earth to forgive sins. He forgives sins through the priest...it is God's power, but He exercises that power through the ministry of the priest.

The church wants us to receive the sacrament on reconciliation at least once a year, and before we receive communion if we have committed a mortal sin (a sin of grave matter, that you know is wrong that you commit deliberately) but that is a bare minimum! We are encouraged to seek reconciliation whenever we are in need of its healing grace!
